



Somaliland Weekly Weather Forecast 4 to 10 June 2025

Issued: 05 June 2025

Dry conditions are expected to persist across most parts of Somaliland. However, localized light rainfall is likely in parts of Sanaag and Togdheer regions, particularly over Ceel-afwayn, Ceerigaabo, Oodwayne and southern parts of Burco district.

Warabeye (55.0mm), Borama (54.0 mm), Burco (54.0 mm), Sheikh (48.0 mm), Ceerigaabo (46.0), Amoud (45.0 mm), Taysa (45.0 mm), Oodwayne (42.0mm), Qolujeed (42.0mm), Yagoori (41.0mm), Balidhiig (40.0 mm), Dilla (38.0 mm), Cadadley (36.0 mm), and Harirad (33.0 mm), Ceel-afwayn (32.0 mm), Gabiley (31.0 mm), Geeddeble (31.0 mm), Dhubato (30.0 mm), Magalo cad (28.0mm), Botor (27.0 mm), Alleybadey (38.0 mm), Gacanlibaax (21.0 mm) and Harirad, (33.0 mm).

Weather Review for the Month of May

During the past month, many parts of Somaliland received light to moderate rains, which is likely to positively impacted on soil moisture conditions. Some of the stations that recorded good rainfall amounts include Hargeisa (121.0 mm), Baki (113.0 mm), Balligubadle (110.0 mm), Seyla (90.0 mm), Salaxley (82.0 mm), Gumburaha (79.0 mm), Garbodarar (76.0 mm), Aburiin (55.0 mm),

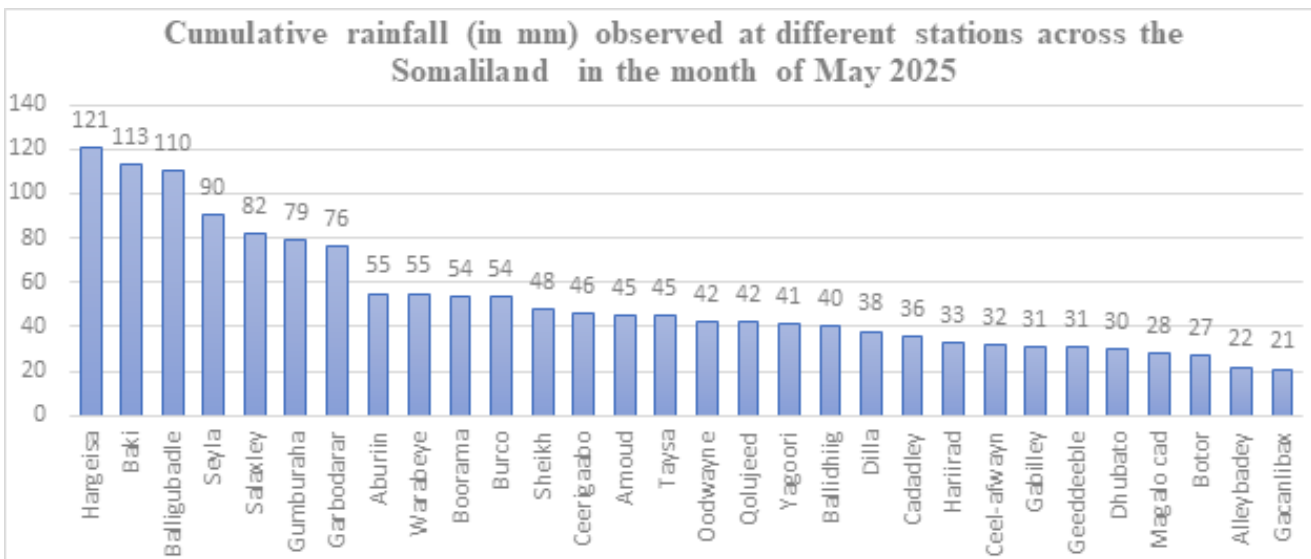


Figure 1: Cumulative rainfall observed across Somaliland in the month of May 2025

Rainfall Forecast (04 - 10 June 2025)

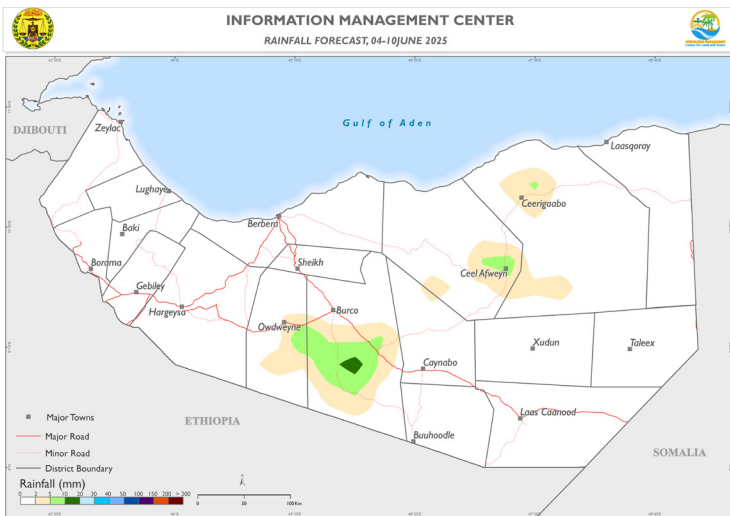
For the upcoming week, the NOAA-NCEP GFS model forecasts generally dry conditions are expected to prevail over large parts of central and western parts Somaliland. Light rainfall of less than 30 mm is likely over select areas of Ceel-afwayn and Ceerigaabo districts in Sanaag region, Oodwayne and Southern parts of Burco districts in Togdheer region.

The spatial distribution of the forecast rainfall (Map 1) is as follows:

- **Light cumulative rainfall of less than 30 mm** is expected in Ceerigaabo and over Ceel-afwayn districts in Sanaag region, most parts in southern of Burco and Oodwayne districts in Togdheer region.
- **Dry conditions** are likely to prevail over most parts of Awdal, Maroodijeex, Saaxil and Togdheer regions.

Impacts Associated with the Month of May, 2025

The rains received in the month of May had a positive effect on agro-pastoral livelihoods across Somaliland, enhancing soil moisture for crops and fodder and replenishing surface and groundwater resources. However, the forecasted hot and dry conditions for the upcoming week are likely to increase evapotranspiration, potentially adversely affecting crop and pasture growth. Therefore, implementing water conservation measures and protecting existing crops and fodder is essential.
